

Does the BEST award of the year come from Your University?

Each year Jusek, VJS, Computer Sweden and Sundsvall42 awards the best examination paper in computer science, or equivalent. The prize ceremony takes place at the annual IT conference Sundsvall42. First prize is 30 000 SEK. The second prize, known as the Runner-up award, is 20 000 SEK.

Every college and university may submit two theses. It is the scientific institution, department, or equivalent, which nominates the thesis. Theses at bachelor and master 1 level (kandidat och magister), which was approved during the period June 19 2009 - 30 June 2010, may be nominated.

The application should include:

- A summary of the work to a maximum of two A4 pages. Please see suggestions of how the summary can be structured at www.jusek.se/best
- The complete thesis in Word format, or other format that can be edited
- Contact information to the institution, and a contact person

The jury starts by reading the summaries, and based on those, five finalists are decided. Next step for the jury is to carefully read these five complete theses. Finally, the jury appoints the theses that are to receive the BEST award and the runner-up prize.

The jury consists of Chairman *Louise Yngström*, professor at the Department of Computer and Systems Sciences at Stockholm University, *Lars Dahmén*, IDG president, *Elisabeth Eriksson*, President at Jusek IT division, *Lennart Forsebäck*, futurist and author, *Kurt Gladh*, former CEO Dataföreningen and *Bo Dahlbom*, head of research and development at Sustainable Innovation.
